## Starbucks – north and south campus

While Starbucks may be the cliché go-to coffee shop, the environment of the shops on campus provides academic support and a relaxing study atmosphere. Students who live on campus and lack transportation can utilize both the north and south Starbucks locations.

One of the benefits of the north campus Starbucks is the location itself. Near a dining hall and within walking distance of most freshmen residence halls, it is an easy place to escape on campus. In terms of study space, this location is not ideal due to the tight spaces, however if a tall table near the window is available it can be an excellent place to hunker down, plug in and get organized for the school year. ## Kickstand Kafé – 719 N. Humphreys St.

Despite the distance from campus, Kickstand is another option for a comfortable study space. With leather couches, bar stools and wide tables, it is easy to find a place for your study needs. Kickstand is known for their friendly customer service, as well as their "fixie," a blend of tea, cinnamon and almond milk, a soothing pick-me-up during a study break. ### Campus Coffee Bean – 1800 S. Milton Rd.

If your study space must include a food menu with options other than pastries, Campus Coffee Bean is the place for you. Initially, it might feel like a traditional coffee house, but their lengthy breakfast, lunch and dinner menus make the shop feel more like a comfortable restaurant. Various meals offered include American, Mexican and even Mediterranean dishes, but the menu goes beyond those specific cuisines.
